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Principal's Report—from Mr Coffey

Doing Asbestos We Can!

I am happy to say that after a lengthy wait the asbestos has safely been removed from the canteen area. This will allow the remaining works to be completed, including the installation of new vinyl and joinery in the canteen and the upgrade to the air conditioning.

Work will also commence this term on the new shade area on the northern side of the multi-purpose building at this stage I am expecting the shade area to be completed before the end of the school year.

We are also continuing to work with the architects to develop the drawings for the School Pride project that will see the rejuvenation of the Albert Street entrance and 'A' block, (the original Rainbow High School building). These works will commence in the New Year.

2017 Planning

We are also well into our planning for the 2017 school year with the VCE subject selection process well underway and the work force planning arrangements starting to develop.

Victoria's Child Safe Standards

In 2013, the Victorian Parliament held an Inquiry into the Handling of Child Abuse by Religious and Other Non-Government organisations, resulting in the Betrayal of Trust Report.

The report found that more could be done to strengthen existing approaches to child safety. In response, the Victorian Government is phasing in child safe standards for organisations that work with children, including schools. The child safe standards require schools to consider all aspects of child safety and put measures in place to protect children from all forms of abuse, including:

- sexual or grooming offences
- physical violence
- serious emotional or psychological harm
- serious neglect.

We will keep you updated on the changes and additions to our processes and policies.

- The activities were too easy for the year 9 and 10 students they were not challenging enough.


