2019 Internet Code of Practice – Early Years (P-2)

Agreement

2019 Internet Code of Practice – Years 3 to 12

Student Agreement

I agree to use the Internet, and any other electronic messaging systems, e.g., texting, in a responsible manner, but if I find myself in unsuitable locations I will immediately click on HOME **or turn the monitor off** and inform the teacher (school hours), or my parent (after school-hours).

When using the Internet at Rainbow P-12 College I will:

- 1. Not use the Internet to cyber-bully, frighten or annoy another person.
- 2. Not use the Internet to portray other students in a mean way.
- 3. Only work on the Web for purposes specified by my teacher.
- 4. Not give out personal information such as my surname, E-mail details, address, phone number(s), parents' work address / telephone number.
- 5. Never send a person my picture, unless I gain specific teacher approval and I understand that some issues such as sending explicit/unacceptable personal photos may attract criminal charges and have longer term consequences.
- 6. Compose E-mail or text messages using only language I understand is acceptable in my school.
- 7. Not respond to any messages that are unpleasant or that make me feel uncomfortable in any way and to report these instances to my parents or teachers.
- 8. I will not use material from other websites, (excepting for class assignments), unless I have permission from the person who created the material. If I am unsure I will check with my teacher.
- 9. Follow school guidelines and procedures when preparing materials for publication on the Web.
- 10. Not use the school Internet, computers and digital learning devices or the ICT network in breach of a law or to commit an offence. This includes cyber-bullying, the sending of explicit/unacceptable personal photos, and breaches of copyright.

While the Internet may be largely a self-regulated environment, the general principles of law and community standards still apply to communication and publishing via the Internet. In addition to school penalties, there are legal sanctions for improper use of the Internet.

I understand that breaches of the rules will see me lose my Internet and/or printing privileges for a period of time to be determined by the school and that criminal matters may be referred to the police.

HEAD LICE INSPECTIONS

Throughout the year, the school will be arranging head lice inspections of students.

The management of head lice infestation works best when all children are involved in our screening program.

The school is aware that this can be a sensitive issue and is committed to maintaining student confidentiality and avoiding stigmatisation.

Before any inspections are conducted staff will explain to all students what is being done and why, and it will be emphasised to students that the presence of head lice in their hair does not mean that their hair is less clean or well kept than anyone else's. It will also be pointed out that head lice can be itchy and annoying and if you know you have got them, you can do something about it.

The inspection of students will be conducted by local volunteer parent helpers and if available the Shire Health Inspector.

The person conducting the inspections will physically search through each student's hair to see if any lice or eggs are present.

In cases where head lice are found, the person inspecting the student will inform the student's class teacher and the principal. The school will inform the parents and provide parents with comprehensive advice about the use of safe treatment practices which do not place children's health at risk.

Please note that the law requires that where a child has head lice, that child should not return to school until appropriate treatment has commenced.
