Student Leadership Recognised

This week the College was informed that one of our students, Mikayla Keller has been awarded the Helen Handbury Leadership Award for 2019. The presentation of the award will occur early next term.

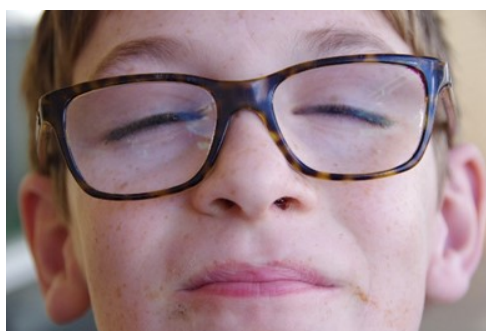

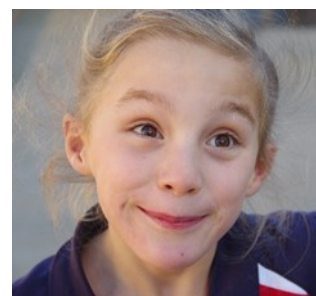

There will be an OFF Road buggy for demonstration purposes.***
