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### School Production

### Only 25% Response Rate!

So far we only have 10 surveys completed of the 40 we previously sent out. The closing date of the survey has been extended to this Sunday the 18<sup>th</sup> of August so hopefully we will be closer to our 100% target, set last year. Approximately 50 per cent of parents have been invited to participate in this year's survey; however at this stage we will only have 12.5% of our parents providing feedback to us.
