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Principal's Report from Mr. Coffey

Code Red

Once a Code Red day has been determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner this decision will not change – regardless of any changes in the weather forecast.

Rainbow P-12 College is not on the Department's bushfire at-risk register therefore we will remain open on a CODE RED FIRE DAY, unless directly threatened by fire or another emergency. Normal school classes are anticipated to run on these days.

Our Emergency Management Plan's response is In the event of a CODE RED FIRE DAY, no bus services will run.

This week we aimed to inform all parents of the Code Red day via the Skoolbag app, our Facebook page and using Class Dojo, as soon as we were notified after school on Wednesday. Code Red days are also advertised on radio, television and through the CFA app and gives parents, where advisable, the opportunity to organise alternative arrangements. When a school or early childhood service is closed due to a Code Red day determination, no staff will remain on site and all out-of-school care programs (including vacation, before and after school programs) will not operate.

More 2020 News

Our junior school class configuration for 2020 is Prep/1 with Mrs. Huff, Year 2/3 with Miss Downing, Year 4 with Miss Teasdale and Miss Newton and Year 5/6 with Mrs. Gregory. The senior area of the school will experience some change with a straight Year 7 home group, Years 8 and 9 combined and a straight Year 10 home group. It is that time of year again where the College is organising the final two weeks of term. Activities Week will be run during Week 10 and Week 11 of term 4. The Junior and Senior sections of the College will be participating in a variety of activities and excursions. Junior School Activities Week

All junior school students are required to contribute a small fee of \$5.00 to go towards paying for resources for the two weeks of activities. This includes art and craft items, groceries and cooking ingredients as well as and other student consumables. There are NO other costs for the two weeks of activities. Students do not need to bring a container for their cooking. They will be making a tie bag and container for their food items. All they need to do is bring their money and that's it. Each grade level is rotating through all activities over the 4 periods (2 on Monday and 2 on Wednesday Week 10)

Senior School Activities Week

All senior students who have selected cooking on Monday 9^{th} Dec (Week 10) will need to bring \$5.00 to take home their items. If students do not bring the small fee they will not be able to take the food item home. Students who have selected cooking on Tuesday 17^{th} Dec (Week 11) WILL NOT have to bring money as they will be preparing food items for the whole school lunch on the following day. Senior students who have selected any art or craft activities over the two weeks are required to bring \$5.00 to pay for resources and consumables, and so they can take home their artwork at the end of the session. Senior students attending the Lake Lascelles Day Trip to Hopetoun need to pay their \$10.00 to the school by the 6^{th} December, along with their permission form (given separately). This will cover the cost of transport and their BBQ lunch.
