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Principal's Report from Mr Coffey

Keeping it Uniform!

Each winter we have our senior school students wearing hoodies under the school approved rugby top due to the complaint that the rugby tops aren't warm enough. We are currently seeking feedback from students, parents and staff on an alternative winter jacket for our students. Samples of the 2 alternatives are available for perusal in the front office, along with a voting slip to record your preferred option. There is a half zip navy blue jumper and a full zip red and navy jacket to select from. We have sought to provide alternatives that are available in the widest range of sizes, are readily available and most importantly, warm. As the items are samples only the white embroidered school logo is missing. The jackets will be on display until next Friday the 6th of March.

Keep it going!

Our school's improvement in student attendance is continuing due to parent support, improved student engagement and the safe and supportive school environment that staff provide. In 2019 we had an amazing 53% of our Prep to Year 6 students miss less than 10 days, on average, for the year. Only 14% of our Prep to Year 6 students missed 20 days or more compared to the results for similar schools (25%) and the state (27%). The picture is equally positive in the senior school, for very good attendance for many of our students, with a solid 44% of our Year 7 to Year 12 students missing less than 10 days, on average, for the year. Even though our results are better than similar schools (34%) and the state results (32%) it is concerning that 25% of our senior students missed more than 20 days for 2019. This year we are striving to improve the attendance of our senior students, especially those completing Years' 10, 11 and 12. Remember Every Day Counts and we can't teach them if they are not here.

On Monday the 24th students went back to the pool at 1pm to complete the remaining events of butterfly, breaststroke and team relays. Staff were pleased with the students' attendance and participation rates for both days. There were even students putting their hands up to compete in extra events on the day which was excellent.

The success of the students was overwhelming with 17 records broken over the course of the two days. Hindmarsh was the overall winning house on 1169.5 points defeating Albacutya on 1088.5 points. 
The day went pretty good and I really enjoyed it. I tried my hardest and everybody did exceedingly well.


