Principal's Report from Mr Coffey

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Capital Works Program

The AMP (Asset Management Plan) document for Phase 1 of the Capital Works program was submitted to the region last Thursday the 4th of February.

The AMP was developed by collating the online survey responses from the 142 community members who completed it, consulting with school staff and school council members and adding the data regarding our current facility entitlements and a description of the current condition of our facilities and infrastructure.

The week leading up to the submission of the AMP was busy with draft documents being forwarded to staff and school council for review and feedback.

The submission we forwarded is a fair representation of the myriad ideas collected from a range of stakeholders, due to the transparent consultation process used to develop the document.

The VSBA (Victorian Schools Building Authority) Senior Project Officer contacted me on Monday to begin coordinating phase 2 of the AMP which will see the design of facilities that best support the desired outcomes.

At Monday night's School Council meeting, it was approved to refund each family who FULLY paid their school fees in 2020 a credit. A credit of \$100 for each student in each family who was enrolled with us last year will be refunded to the family account.

Leaving School Grounds

As it is the beginning of the school year we would like to clarify and reinforce the correct process for parents giving permission for students to leave the school grounds, during school times.

All students are only permitted to leave school grounds with prior written parent consent. This written consent should be passed on to the student's home group teacher or the front office. Where a student is considered to be sufficiently mature (i.e. senior students) to leave the school grounds independently they are able to do so with a valid reason and the knowledge and consent of their parents. The school considers a valid reason is the student is going to their home for lunch but not having lunch


<u>Great Victorian Bike Ride 2021 from Tessa Leach - GVBR Student Coordinator</u>

School attendance

Below are some interesting statistics about attendance.

0-12 days Absences over the year

(Acceptable range)

Excellent attendance. High attendance correlates with success and achievement at school. Children have the best chance to learn and develop strong friendships.

13 - 20 days Absences over the year

(Below average attendance- if this continues between prep and year 10 it is equal to one year of missed schooling).

Below average attendance can influence your child's learning and social opportunities.

21 -40 days Absences over the year

(Poor attendance- if this continues between prep and year 10 it is equal to two years of missed schooling).

Students who miss between 21 – 40 days may not achieve their best learning and they may have difficulty maintaining steady friendships.

Absences 40+ days

(Extreme Concern)

Absences of 40+ days is of extreme concern. This can lead to severe learning difficulties and can affect your child's lifelong relationship issues. Children with irregular and poor attendance are severely disadvantaged learners.
