# Principal's Report from Mr Coffey

We wish to extend a friendly Mallee welcome to another new student! This week we had Melissa Clark join our Year 9 class. If we maintain this increase in enrolments we may not be able to continue promoting our small class sizes! I'm sure Melissa will enjoy our safe and friendly rural school and the rich opportunities our community provides. Mellissa's arrival brings our total enrolment to 114 students, with 54 students in the junior school and 60 students in the senior school.

### **Ecolinc - from Mrs Roll**

We were extremely fortunate to have a visit from Anthony, Ainsley and Amy from Ecolinc as part of their Outreach program on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> May. Ecolinc is a science and technology innovations centre that provides sustainable environment programs for Victorian government schools. Students from Prep-Year 8 were involved in the workshops across the day which included:

- Paper as a resource
- Water as a resource
- Wind power
- Hydrogen fuel cells (green energy)

Some of the Year 5/6 students described their wind energy session, testing what made an efficient wind turbine:

There were two groups on blade length, two groups on blade angle, and two groups on the number of blades to test which wind turbine produced the most energy - Oscar

We made a wind turbine and there were two cords that attached to the volt meter. I got to read the volts - Lily

It was lots of fun but we had to think hard when we had to put the blade on the certain angle - Zach

Students had an excellent and informing time in the sessions and we can't wait until the next time Ecolinc can come and visit our school - thanks Ecolinc for the fantastic opportunity!


During remote learning a survey went out to all students to get an idea of what they thought about student voice.

65 response as of 4/6/21


Do you think the opinions of students about our school are valued by teachers? 65 responses



1: none at all -5: lots


Do you feel like you have the opportunity to have input into some of the decisions made within vour school?

65 responses




1:not really - 5: absolutely
