BUILDING WORKS - UPDATE #9 2022

There has been a fair bit of action on the Building Works front.

- Greenlight Services completed a hazardous materials audit
- Staff completed a very detailed survey to provide feedback on the use of each space

- Next week we have a meeting with the Barengi Gadjin (Aboriginal Traditional Owner Group)

COVID UPDATE

The new COVIDsafe guidelines for Term Two include:

- RAT testing will continue for at least the first four weeks of Term 2.
- Masks are no longer compulsory for staff and Grade 3-6 students (but are still provided for any staff member or student who wants to continue to wear them)
- Close contacts of positive cases no longer need to isolate at home **BUT** must wear masks at school and RAT test 5 out of the next 7 days.

We received a number of air purifiers yesterday. We will install these to ensure that all classrooms and office areas are effectively ventilated during the winter months. They will be set-up in classrooms and office areas during the upcoming week.


