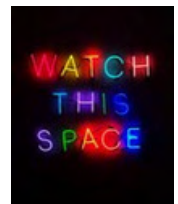


OUR YEAR 12 STUDENTS....THE WAIT WILL BE WORTH IT!!!

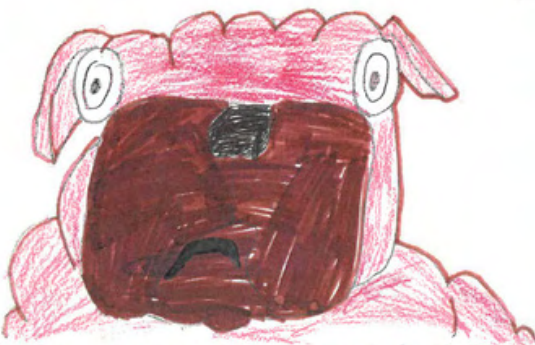
Book Review- Pig The Rebel
