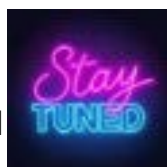
## Leadership Report / Weekly Roundup

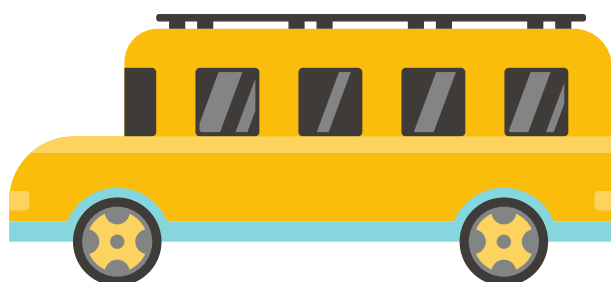

## Year 9 Sailing Camp Review

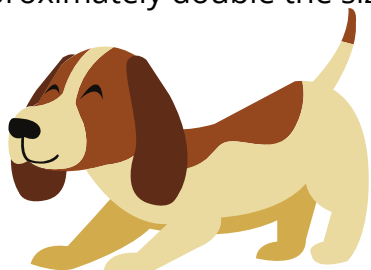
