

### BOOK WEEK PARADE

#### **Slice Recipes**

Mrs Cashill shared some delicious slices during the week - Thank you to her mum, Lynette Teasdale for these recipes

#### Jelly Slice

125g melted butter
175g crushed biscuits (take
10 out of a 250g packet)
Mix together and press into
the base of a greased & lined
slice container. Chill.

1 tin condensed milk

3/4 cup boiling water

2 teas gelatine

4 tab lemon juice

Dissolve gelatine in water.

Add juice & milk. Pour over

base. Chill.

1 pkt red jelly
1½ cups boiling water
Make up jelly. Leave to cool
slightly. Pour gently over
back of spoon. Chill.

#### **Apple Sour Cream Slice**

1 pkt vanilla cake mix (or 1 cup plain flour & 1 cup icing sugar)
1 cup coconut
125g melted butter

Mix together. Press into slice tin (I line the bottom & two sides with baking paper so I can lift it out when cold). Bake in moderate oven (about 160) 10-15 min.

> 300ml sour cream 400g tin pie apple 1 tab caster sugar 1 egg.

Mix together & spread on base. Sprinkle with cinnamon. Bake a further 10-15 minutes. Cool in tin, then slice.

#### **Easy Caramel Slice**

250g butter, chopped 4 tab golden syrup 1 tin condensed milk 4 tab brown sugar

Combine all ingredients in a bowl and melt in microwave for 5 minutes, stirring well every minute.

Add 2 packets of crushed marie biscuits and pour into the caramel mixture. Mix well and pour into slice container. I line with cooking spray and baking paper so it is easy to remove and slice.

Icing:

125g melted copha
4 tab icing sugar
3 tab drinking chocolate
1 tab cocoa
Mix well and pour over base. I
like to bang it against the
table to ensure it is smooth.
