

Sailing Camp Report



Day 1:

On the first day we left school at about 9am. We drove to Ballarat where we stopped for lunch at KFC and McDonalds. Once we had drove the rest of the way, we arrived at Barwon River side caravan park. We settled into our cabins and explored around for a bit. There was a dinosaur park and half basketball court. We went shopping for the food for the next day and for our own cabins. We had a BBQ for tea, with movies or games in our cabins before bed.

Day 2:

On the second day we got up and ready for our fist day of sailing. When we got to the Royal Geelong Yacht Club we met the instructors Lincoln and Dave. We went up to a room and were taught the different jobs when sailing. The skipper steers the boat, crew one controls the main sail and crew two controls the jib sail. We went down and got the boats all set up. We set the sails up before heading back for lunch. After we ate, we went to get life jackets and went back to the boats and walked them into the water. We set off one at a time and nearly all the boats except one were sailing before it got too windy for the smaller boats, so they were brought back in. Once we put our life jackets back, we got on the bus and started heading to Torquay. However, we never got there because the bus broke down. We ended up stuck at a petrol station for a bit before Mr Glover's daughter Paige took us back to the caravan park in groups of 4, in her car. When we got back it was back to exploring the park. For tea that night we made our own tea in our cabins, then it was followed by more movies and games in our cabins.

Day 3:

On the third day we still didn't have a bus, so we had to get 2 taxis and a maxi cab to get to sailing. It was much calmer, so we got our life jackets on and set the small boats up again. We sailed in almost a figure 8 shaped going around floating markers. We sailed back in for lunch, then went back out again. Once we finished sailing, we walked to the train station and caught a train. Once we got off, we walked for a bit to get to Bounce. We were at Bounce for about 2 hours. By then we had hired a bus and went out to mini golf at Curlewis. We played 18 holes and had burgers.

Day 4:

On the fourth day we took the hired bus to sailing. We put life jackets on and set up the boats again. We sailed in more of a triangle getting used to the different turns before seeing who could get to one of the instructors' boats first by zig zagging. After lunch we split into 4 groups and went out on the power boats. Each instructor had a boat so 2 groups went at a time. We went out and had a look around further than we went when we were in the small boats. After sailing had finished, we walked to a shopping centre for a couple hours of shopping. By the time we had finished we had our bus back again. We went to the caravan park again before going down High Street to get food. After we ate, we went on a ghost tour at the old Geelong gaol. We had a guide and we walked around inside. We were told lots of interesting stories about prisoners that had been held there and the girl's school that had run for a bit at the same time. When we got back to the caravan park some started to pack up to leave for the next day.

Day 5:

On the final day we woke up, had breakfast, and packed up. Once the trailer was packed and we were all ready we set off for home. We stopped in Horsham for lunch, and we continued home. Once we got back to school, we had a gratitude circle for what was a challenge, what we enjoyed and what we were grateful for. We cleaned the bus out and got all our stuff and that was the end of our camp.

The year 9/10 class would like to give a massive thank you to Miss Wizz's parents for lending her a car and Steph, Caitlyn and Paige Glover for helping us as well.

We would also like to thank Miss Wizz and Mr Glover for taking us.





