


MONEY FOR CANS & BOTTLES CAN NOW BE DONATED TO RAINBOW P-12 COLLEGE!



ACTIVITIES WEEK

Information for families regarding Activities Week 2023

STUDENTS MAY WEAR CASUAL CLOTHES ALL WEEK

Monday 11th December: We will spend half of the day at the Rainbow Lake. **BBQ lunch will be provided.** If your child does not eat sausages or hamburgers, please send a packed lunch with them. We will be allowing students to swim, supervised by qualified lifeguards, so please pack bathers and towel and life jacket if needed. They can also bring fishing gear if they would like to have a fish. Sunscreen will be provided, but please send your own if your child has sensitive skin.

Tuesday 12th December: Periods 1&2 are Presentation Night Practice. ALL STUDENTS are expected to attend this, even those who have finished school for the year. Those students my leave at recess.

Tuesday is also Transition Day for the new Prep and Year 7 students. There will be a number of transition activities for these students.

Students need to bring their own lunch today.

Wednesday 13th December: If your child is participating in the gaming session in the morning, they are welcome to bring a device from home with downloaded games if you want them to. The school takes no responsibility for these items, but will do our best to ensure they are stored safely.

During Period 3 & 4 students will be going to the Rainbow Swimming Pool. **Please send bathers, towel, goggles if needed**, and sunscreen for sensitive skin (we will provide regular sunscreen).

<u>There will be a whole school celebration lunch today. Students from Years 8/9 who left school early for harvest work are requested to attend this lunch.</u>

Thursday 14th December: There is a crop tour for some students today. If your child is attending this, they must wear sun-safe clothes, work boots and bring a broad-brimmed hat. They should pack a water bottle and a snack for morning tea. They will be travelling on the school bus and van with Mr Robinson and Kimberly Bye.

There is a music concert in the hall in the afternoon, which all parents and friends are invited to attend. This will begin at 1.30.

Students need to bring their own lunch today.

Friday 15th December: Today we invite ALL FAMILY AND FRIENDS to join us in a Family Fun Day to finish off Activities Week. There will be a number of games and fun events for students, parents and friends to participate in. Some of these will involve water, including a slip and slide and possibly water pistols. There will also be a colour run, so please pack bathers and a change of old clothes that can get colour on them. **We invite you to bring a picnic lunch to share with your child. If you can't make it, please send a packed lunch.**

This will begin at 12pm, and go until around 2.30pm. You will be welcome to take your child home with you when you are ready to leave, as long as you let their teacher know.
