

TRAILER TENDER PROCESS


Tender offers for the bike trailer and the smaller driver ed. trailer can still be handed in at the front office up until **10:00am Monday 13th November.**







After a long day, when we said it was bed time, we hardly heard a peep for the whole night. Everyone was extremely puffed!


