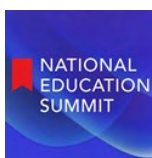
OUR PST FILM STARS

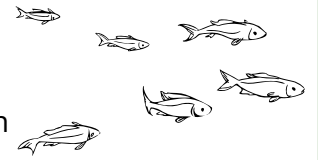

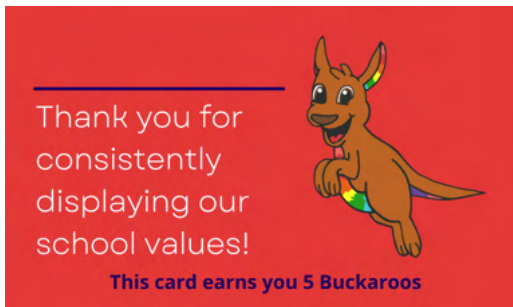
Explosion Card

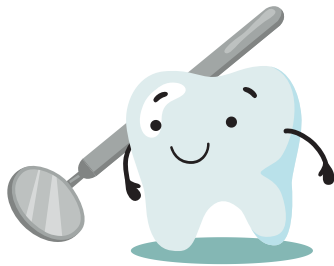

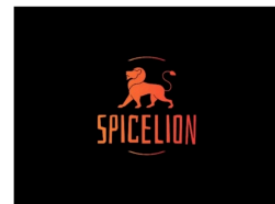

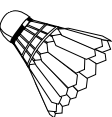
